BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION

Henrietta Ellery Sedgwick Lockwood (1906- 2000) was the daughter of *Atlantic Monthly* Owner and Editor Ellery Sedgwick (27 February 1872- 21 April 1960) and Mabel Cabot Sedgwick (3 July 1873 - 5 March 1937). The couple married in 1904. In 1916 the couple purchased a hundred and fourteen acre property in Beverly, Massachusetts that they named Long Hill. After Mabel Cabot Sedgwick's death in 1937 Ellery Sedgwick married Marjorie Russell (1896-1978), who continued establishing the gardens at Long Hill.

Ellery Sedgwick was the son of Attorney Henry Dwight Sedgwick (16 August 1824- 26 December 1903) and Henrietta Ellery Sedgwick (18 October 1829- 22 February 1899). Although Henry Dwight Sedgwick worked in New York, he commuted weekly to Stockbridge, Massachusetts where his wife raised their five children: Ellery, Henry Dwight Sedgwick (1861-1957), Theodore Sedgwick (1863-1951), Jane Minot Sedgwick (1859-1918), and Alexander Sedgwick (1867-1929).

Ellery Sedgwick was born in New York, New York on 27 February 1872. He graduated from the Groton School in 1890 and Harvard University in 1894. He taught Classics at Groton School from

1894 to 1896. His editorial career included publications such as the *Youth's Companion at Boston*, *Leslie's Monthly Magazine*, and the *American Magazine*. He returned to Boston in 1909 as the editor of the *Atlantic Monthly* and president of the *Atlantic Monthly Company*. He died 21 April 1960 in Washington, District Of Columbia and is buried in the Sedgwick family plot in Stockbridge, Massachusetts.

Mabel Cabot Sedgwick was born in 3 July 1873 in Brookline, Norfolk, and Massachusetts to Walter Channing Cabot (28 Apr 1829- 08 May 1904) and Elizabeth Rogers Mason (25 May 1834-12 December 1920). In 1907, she wrote and published *The Garden Month-By-Month*, a gardening guide. She established the gardens at Long Hill.

In 1917, Mabel Cabot Sedgwick and Ellery Sedgwick moved into a farmhouse at Long Hill, where Mabel Cabot Sedgwick began work on the gardens. Between 1921 and 1925 they constructed a Charleston-style colonial revival house, designed by Philip Richardson of Boston. They purchased the interior woodwork from Ball House, a mansion in Charleston, South Carolina and used this in the building of the house. In 1925, the Sedgwick's moved into the newly constructed house and Mabel Cabot Sedgwick began to create the garden's geometric garden rooms. She died on 05 March 1937 in Boston, Massachusetts.

In 1939, Ellery Sedgwick married (Isabel) Marjorie Russell, daughter of Champion Branfill Russell (1860-1945) and Isabel Ellen Bruce (1860-1934). Marjorie Russell was born on 11 June 1896 in Essex, England. She continued the gardens at Long Hill establishing the Carriage House Garden and developing the woodland slope garden. She was known as a rare plant propagator. She died on 29 November 1978 at Long Hill.

Mabel Cabot Sedgwick and Ellery Sedgwick had four children: Henrietta Ellery Sedgwick Lockwood, Ellery Sedgwick, Jr., Samuel Cabot Sedgwick, and Theodora Sedgwick Bond.

Henrietta Ellery Sedgwick Lockwood was born on 13 May 1906 in New York, New York. She married John Edwards Lockwood (8 April 1904- 31 August 1993) on 14 May 1932 at Long Hill. He was the son of William A. Lockwood (1874-1966) and Elizabeth Edwards. Henrietta was a known horticulturist who established her own garden at her home in Westchester County, New York in 1938, which she continued to work on until her death on 4 August 2000.

Ellery Sedgwick, Jr. was the president and chairman of the Medusa Corporation of Cleveland Heights, Ohio, a leading cement maker. He was born 28 October 1909 in Boston Massachusetts and died on 2 September 1991 in Ohio. He married Irene E. Wade (17 December 1913 – 9 February 2013) in 1941.

Samuel Cabot Sedgwick was a career diplomat with the United States State Department. He was born on 6 February 1913 in Boston Massachusetts and died 24 July 2003 in Oregon. He married Paula Knipe (1916-1990) on 5 January 1941.

Theodora Sedgwick Bond was born on 27 October 1916 in Stockbridge, Massachusetts. She married Bridger General William Bond (4 December 1918-1 Apr 1970). She died in Santa Cruz, Arizona on 27 October 1981.

In 1979, Theodora Sedgwick Bond, Henrietta E.S. Lockwood, Ellery Sedgwick, Jr., and S. Cabot Sedgwick gave Long Hill to The Trustees of Reservations. DESCRIPTION OF THE PAPERS

The Henrietta Lockwood Collection contains correspondence, garden journals and records, horticultural resources, and information and photographs regarding the house and gardens at Long Hill. There is also material regarding Mabel Cabot Sedgwick's book, *The Garden Month by Month*. The collection is organized into eight series: Long Hill, Long Hill Gardens, Correspondence, Photographs, Horticultural Resources, Printed Material, Awards, and Mounted Flowers.

Series I, Long Hill, consists of two subseries, Sedgwick House, and Sedgwick Family. The first subseries, Sedgwick House, include records of items purchased for the hours and a notebook signed by visitors to the house and garden.

The second subseries, Sedgwick Family, include Marjorie Russell Sedgwick's travel journals, and writings about Long Hill and the Sedgwick Family.

Series II, Long Hill Gardens, consists of two subseries, Garden Journals, and Long Hill Gardens General. The first subseries, Garden Journals, consists of garden journals kept by Mabel Cabot Sedgwick and Marjorie Russell Sedgwick.

The second subseries, Long Hill Gardens General, includes plant notes on index cards and plans for a garden kiosk.

Series III, Correspondence, includes correspondence to Mabel Cabot Sedgwick about her *The Garden Month by Month* and wartime correspondence between Marjorie Russell Sedgwick and her sister Pamela Russell Stubbers in England.

Series IV, Photographs, includes photographs of Long Hill, flowers at Long Hill, and Ellery Sedgwick and Mabel Cabot Sedgwick.

Series V. Horticultural Resources includes publications by the Arnold Arboretum and articles about flowers.

Series VI. Printed Material, includes articles about Long Hill and Garden Club of America Bulletins with an article on Mabel Cabot Sedgwick's book *The Garden Month by Month*.

Series VII, Awards, includes a certificate from The Garden Club of America rewarding Marjorie Russell Sedgwick for her horticultural achievement with the North Shore Garden Club and a certificate from The Garden Club of America awarding the Natalie Peters Webster Medal to

Henrietta E.S. Lockwood. Additional awards are detailed in an appendix available at The Trustees of Reservations Archives and Research Center.
